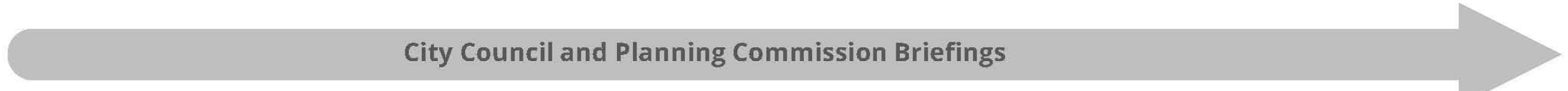

Key Takeaways

- Sandy is **growing** !
- Sandy's median household is **\$73,443** per year
- About **32%** of Sandy's households are cost burdened
- Top employment sectors include **retail trade, accommodation and food services, government, and health care/education**
- Employment in Sandy increased by **23%** between 2008-2019

Housing and Economy

- Goal 9: Economic Development
- Goal 10: Housing

Key Takeaways

- Extreme wildfire danger is expected to **increase to 19 days** per year by the middle of this century
- Drought events have already become **more frequent and extreme** in Sandy

Natural Hazards and Resiliency

- Goal 6: Air, Water, and Land Resources Quality
- Goal 7: Areas Subject to Natural Hazards

Key Takeaways

- There are approximately **10 miles of path/trails** **both within and between parks** in Sandy
- The City works with **many organizations and partners** to assist with maintenance and funding for parks and trails
- Sandy's existing park system and amenities are **aging**
- As population growth continues, geographic distribution of new parks and trails should be **equitable**

Parks, Trails, Natural Resources

- Goal 5: Natural Resources, Scenic and Historic Areas, and Open Space
- Goal 8: Recreational Needs

Key Takeaways

- The City conducts **numerous public involvement activities** for land use processes
- Sandy offers a variety of **volunteer activities**
- Sandy is home to **key civic, arts, and cultural spaces**
- Expanding the technical capacity of the department is critical to **sustaining youth engagement**

Community and Culture

- Goal 1: Citizen Involvement

Key Takeaways

- During the spring, fall, and winter, approximately **50% of the City's supply is purchased from the Portland Water Bureau.**
- There are many **sidewalk gaps** along US26, Meinig Avenue, and Sandy Heights Street
- Dense and active land uses can **support highly productive transit**

Transportation and Infrastructure

- Goal 11: Public Facilities and Services
- Goal 12: Transportation

Key Takeaways

- Sandy's current Comprehensive Plan was last **adopted in 1997**
- In 2017, Sandy **expanded the City's UGB by 668 gross acres**
- Population and employment forecasts have implications for the type and amount of land Sandy will need in order to **accommodate more housing and jobs.**
