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METHODS

- ► Objectives:
 - ✓ Assess likely level of support for potential District formation request
 - ✓ Identify how best to communicate District's benefits
- ► Telephone interviews with registered voters. 41% of interviews conducted on cell phones
- ► List: Voters in area similar to Library District, (includes Sandy, Boring, Eagle Creek, communities east to Alder Creek)
- ► Sample of 300. Worst-case reliability ±5.7%.

► Respondent criteria:


- ✓ Lives in proposed District area
- ✓ Self-described as voter 81% vote in every election; 14% in Primary & General; 5% Presidential only
- ✓ Gender (54%/45% female/male, 1% not identified). Final data weighted to balance female/male 50/50. Weighted n=303. (Difference compared to raw data is minimal)
- ▶ Interviews conducted March 6 to March 21, 2020
 - ✓ Overlaps with rising Covid 19 virus concerns everywhere.

RESEARCH RESULTS

Respondent demographics


Most are long-time residents: Average is 27 years.

Q: How long have you lived in the City of Sandy or one of the surrounding communities?




As expected, voters are also older. Average age is 60 years

4 in 10 voters have a college degree, 8 in 10 at least some post-secondary education

Q: What is the last year of education you had the opportunity to complete?



Other demographics: A quarter have children at home & 9 in 10 are homeowners

- ► Homeownership: 90% own home
- ► Children under 18: 25% have children in home

Reaction to District formation request

INITIAL "ASK" DESCRIPTION

The City of Sandy and surrounding communities are organizing an effort to form an Aquatics and Recreation District to serve the residents of these communities.

As envisioned, the District would renovate and operate the currently closed Aquatics Center at the 40-acre Community Campus in Sandy. The improved Aquatics Center would include a renovated indoor pool for year-round use. The District would also offer a range of recreational programs, for example soccer, dance, and music, that are designed to serve all ages throughout the District.


A "yes" vote would result in the creation of the District, along with the establishment of a permanent property tax rate of \$1.11 per thousand of assessed value, not market value. For property assessed at \$200,000, about average for residential property in the proposed District, the cost would be \$222 per year.

If the District is created, a 5-member board of directors would be elected to provide management and oversee future direction for the District.

THREE VOTING QUESTIONS

- ► If the election were held today, would you vote "yes" for the formation of an Aquatics and Recreation District or "no" against the formation of a District?
- ▶ If "don't know:" If you had to make a decision today, would you say you are leaning toward voting for or against the formation of an Aquatics and Recreation District?
- ▶ If "yes:" District formation could be on the ballot as early as November 2020 and other funding measures may be on the ballot at that time. How strong is your support for the formation of an Aquatics and Recreation District? (very, somewhat, or not confident of voting "yes").


Initial support by only 43% of voters (actual "yes" almost always lower than "initial yes")



The disparity in voting preference between men & women is larger than typical — 22-point difference

- ► Women are much more likely to give initial support (54% initial "yes") than are men (32%)
 - ✓ A gender differential in the 10-12 percentage point range on other money measures tested is more common
- ► Other voter segments more likely to initially indicate they would vote "yes:"
 - ✓ Voters under 65 (48%) more than 65 or older (39%)
 - ✓ Children in the household. Of those with a child under 18 at home, 66% "yes"
 - ✓ Lives in Sandy ZIP code 97055 (48%) compared to (35%) for those in other ZIP codes.

27% are "very confident" they will support District formation; 23% are Fence Sitters



Fence Sitters are Voters who may support the bond but are not firmly committed to a "yes" vote, so may change mind. Getting information to *Fence* **Sitters** typically key to success


Fence Sitters = 23% Somewhat confident (15%) + Leaning "yes" (6%) + Don't know (2%)

Projection indicates Aquatics & Recreation District formation is not likely to pass

Projection Assumptions:

√All "very confident" voters (27%) will vote "yes"

 $\sqrt{1/3}$ of Fence Sitters (8%) will vote "yes"



Interpreting the projection

- ► The projection assumes minimal change in relevant factors including economic confidence of voters and general reputation of local government
- ▶ Economic confidence during survey period was low due to global pandemic conditions — even over the 2-week survey period, initial yes percentage declined by a few percentage points
- ► Historical trends suggest virtually no chance for passage in near future
- ► Aquatics-only District (discussed later in report) has a bit more potential but still has little chance until economic shock passes.

Reaction to District facts



Full text of statements

- ▶ If approved, the District would have a property tax rate of \$1.11 per thousand of assessed value, not market value. For property assessed at \$200,000, the cost would be \$222 per year or \$18.50 a month
- ► Residents living in the District would pay lower fees than out-of-District residents to use District facilities, including the pool
- ► The City of Sandy does not have the funds necessary to renovate and operate the pool. If the Aquatics and Recreation District is not formed, the pool would likely be permanently closed
- ► The boundaries of the District would be similar to those of the Sandy Library Service Area and would include the City of Sandy as well as Boring, Eagle Creek, and communities east of Sandy to Alder Creek
- ► The City of Sandy would turn over operation of its current recreation programs to the proposed District and the District would expand the recreational programs offered, including programs for all ages
- ▶ The renovated pool would be designed to serve District residents for the next 30 years
- ► The proposed tax rate would fund the improvement and renovation of the current indoor pool at the Community Campus in Sandy, as well as ongoing operation of the pool
- ► The Aquatics Center would be located on Community Campus property that the City anticipates upgrading by adding features such as playgrounds and walking trails to the river
- ► Community meeting spaces would be available in the renovated building at the Community Campus
- ▶ If the District is formed, the City of Sandy anticipates using urban renewal funds to establish a community center on the campus with space that could be leased to the District for recreation programs

Most useful facts relate to costs & keeping pool open



Normalize data to identify key messages

- ► Tendency for individuals or groups to rate all items higher or lower. Grand mean of very useful ratings by segment:
 - ✓ Very Confident (81%), Fence Sitters (66%), No (35%)
- ▶ To address issue, normalize data. 2 steps:
 - ✓ Determine "grand mean" average of averages for each segment
 - ✓ Determine how far above or below each statement's rating is from grand mean
- ► Higher above grand mean, more important to communicate.

Statements improve "yes" voter confidence, change opinion of some "unsure" or "no" voters

After District formation statements read...

- ► Some who initially said "no" or "unsure" change to saying "yes" a theoretic 5-point swing toward initial "yes" overall (from 43% to 48%)
- ► Percentage of respondents who are "very confident" of "yes" vote rises just 2 points from 27% to 29%
- ► Real-world change likely to be less because not all voters will receive all information.


Aquatics-only follow up question:

Q: A different approach under consideration is to form just an Aquatics District with the sole purpose of renovating and operating the Aquatics Center at the Community Campus in Sandy. The current indoor pool would be renovated and staffed, but the District would offer no other recreational programs or amenities.

The tax rate associated with this type of District would be 67¢ per thousand of assessed value. For property valued at \$200,000 the cost would be \$134 per year rather than the \$222 per year for an Aquatics and Recreation District.

If voters are asked to form an Aquatics District, would you vote "yes" for the formation of an Aquatics District or "no" against the District?

Aquatics District gains just 6 more "yes" points over Aquatics & Recreation District (49% initial yes, compared to 43% — still low)




While Aquatics-only District earns a bit more support, passage will still be a challenge

- ► As shown, Aquatics District gains just 6 more "yes" points over Aquatics & Recreation District (49% initial yes, compared to 43% still low)
- ► Under the most generous assumption (that those who switched to "no" for the lesser-cost District from "yes" on the more expensive one would have said "yes" if only one scenario were asked), the initial yes could be as high as 57%
 - ✓ That large a shift in the positive direction is very unlikely
 - ✓ Ignores likelihood that at least some no voters who said "yes" did so only in comparison (to encourage the lower cost option after hearing the more expensive one).

CONCLUSIONS & RECOMMENDATIONS

Economic uncertainty undermines likelihood of passing District formation

- ► Voters make decisions about measures impacting their own property taxes based on 3 factors:
 - ✓ Perceived community benefit of intended purpose
 - ✓ Trust in organization to use tax dollars wisely
 - ✓ Degree of personal economic confidence
- ► The issue that is hardest to control economic confidence makes voter-approval of an Aquatics & Recreation District unlikely in the near term.

World events in the Spring of 2020 make predictions especially challenging

- ► There is little historic comparison to the current economic situation, making forecasting difficult
 - ✓ Other than November 2008 election (shortly after a major market decline), voting results have met, or sometimes beaten, our projections
 - ✓ However, in '08, results in November were about 10 points below projections developed the previous May, when economic confidence was much higher
- ► In this case, significant economic (& health) anxiety was already present during the survey period
 - ✓ Without a return of reasonable economic confidence, we
 do not see a path to passage of either option.

Delay the vote & evaluate lower cost options

- Delay any District formation vote until pandemic disruption is passed
 - ✓ With economic rebound, better support can be expected from all groups, though passage is not assured
- ► Based on current data, Aquatics-only District, while still a challenge, has greater likelihood of passage
 - ✓ While "fence sitters" do consider the value of the benefit (as opposed to just the cost), difference between \$1.11 per thousand for Aquatics & Rec compared to 67¢ per thousand for Aquatics-alone is substantial.

Consider options in light of unlikely support for District in 2020

- ► Can City afford to maintain closed pool facility until a future when economic confidence returns?
 - ✓ If so, best chance may be 2022 or later, given the importance of younger voter support
- ► If City can afford to wait, then lay groundwork for a District-formation proposal
- ► Consider additional research, when economy improves, to further refine messaging
 - ✓ Particularly relevant for evaluating Aquatics-only approach, if selected
 - ✓ Develop descriptions, ballot explanations, & related communications materials based on research results.

5. The City of Sandy and surrounding communities are organizing an effort to form an Aquatics and Recreation District to serve the residents of these communities. As envisioned, the District would renovate and operate the currently closed Aquatics Center at the 40-acre Community Campus in Sandy. The improved Aquatics Center would include a renovated indoor pool for year-round use. The District would also offer a range of recreational programs, for example soccer, dance, and music, that are designed to serve all ages throughout the District.

A "yes" vote would result in the creation of the District, along with the establishment of a permanent property tax rate of \$1.11 per thousand of assessed value, not market value. For property assessed at \$200,000, about average for residential property in the proposed District, the cost would be \$222 per year. If the District is created, a 5-member board of directors would be elected to provide management and oversee future direction for the District.
