- Economic Development Strategic Plan RFP board review of official RFP responses
 - Group discussion about scoring strengths and weaknesses of each proposal

RFP responses:

- Erinn: 2 top choices were ECONorthwest and CAI; ECO being in Portland a plus; CAI did a nice job w/ McMinnville, Astoria; S Brand a definite no.
- Hans: Top choices were CAI, ECONorthwest -- both local to Pacific NW, scored CAI higher but OK with either choice
- Jeremy: Liked that CAI and ECO did their research on our community before responding; liked CAI and ECO also
- staff liaison: Preferred CAI (more specific experience w/ ec dev strategic plans; did a fantastic job with Astoria and especially McMinnville plans; better visual presentation of data)
- Jordan: Liked Astoria and McMinnville plans; ECO integration w/ other plans would be nice, but CAI brings a fresh, different perspective -- CAI clear first choice.
- Ernie: Did not attend but forwarded his score sheets -- CAI was his clear 1st choice.

Board decided that CAI was the consensus winner and instructed staff to check references prior to advancing them as the recommended firm to the City Council for final approval.

6.2. IF TIME PERMITS: Self-storage in Sandy – restrictions on development?

This topic generated by Development Services; they want input from this board.

 These businesses are land intensive, create no jobs, are difficult to redevelop if they fail, and are cheaper to build outside city limits.
 Terrible use of our available developable land.

- We have gotten interest from multiple developers (3?) about this for Skipper/Lundeen.
- Should we ban or restrict these? Fairview just did and has absolutely no regrets. Portland restricts them, so does Vancouver.
- Ban them outright? Eliminate as a permitted use in commercial zones?
 Limit square footage? Must be mixed use? What does the board think?

Board liked the idea of restricting this type of business (Erinn: require them to be mixed-use; Chair: don't ban outright, but commercial zone ban OK and definitely ban in C-1) -- recommend constraints -- set a limit on square footage, require mixed-use or (preferred), or ban outright in C-1 & C-2 (preferred).
