


There are tradeoffs in economic development.





- Portland and Gresham are the most common resident destinations and worker origins.



Median Wage by Industry

- Median household wage is approx. \$60,000.
- All sectors except healthcare fall below the total median
- Service jobs (retail, etc.) median wage is less than half the total median

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
