As many community members are aware, the City received public records requests to release the comment sheets from two meet and greet receptions that were held with police chief finalists on January 3rd.

We are taking this opportunity to provide additional explanation of the City's actions in this matter. After receiving the requests, the City determined that these comments should not be publicly released due to confidentiality and retaliation protections under Oregon law, because they included critical statements from Sandy Police Department employees about multiple finalists for the chief position (their potential future supervisors).

In addition to protecting the public interest and the City's ability to conduct successful recruitments in the future (as the City argued to the Clackamas County District Attorney), the City's intent was to act in the interest of fairness to employees who believed their candid comments would remain private, as well as fairness to all the finalists in the process, both internal and external.

The District Attorney ruled, however, that the sheets must be released (with personal information redacted to protect the individuals who commented). Accordingly, the City is providing the redacted sheets.

He had an understanding of the people and all the departments that make up a police department. He had an understanding of various Report Writing systems that agencies use and knew ours (Eforce) because they are based out of Utah.

I believe in his opening comments that he also made reference to the City; meaning he knew that it was not just about him, it was about what the City's wants and needs were that needed to mesh together with the police department. That only comes from a person who is mature in a Chief's position.

This candidate has already had time to display his talents as he was given the gift of being interim Chief. During this time, his chaotic way of managing (hasty decisions, burning bridges with peers in the industry, lack of emotional intelligence) has been on display.

Although he constantly espouses "loyalty" he has loyalty for no one. If you are the person who is not in the room with him, you are the person he talks about.

His lack of emotional maturity is constantly on display, even making very public comments to the entire police department about his views on people at City Hall. Also lacks the maturity for the "long game". Instead of addressing this opportunity as a time to grow and prepare, he has stated multiple times that "if he does not get the position he will leave". Like a threat he feels he can hold over the City. Instead of saying "I'm willing to work for this, and if this is not my time, I will stay and still do all I can for the City." Nope. It's "give me this because I want it and if you don't I'm out." That is not leadership. That's being a petulant 5 year old.

One of the most serious drawbacks about this candidate is that he "talks the talk", but does not "walk the walk". Community members who have been woo'ed, taken to coffee and like him, do not see daily operations within the police department walls.

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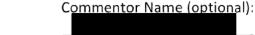

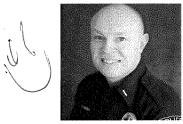

Sean has experience with the job, with the police team, with the community resources he can enlist to help the community, with the problems and possible future probmes of the community, he has experienced hardship with us...COVID, anti-police demonstrations, fire evacuations, Bull Run fire threat, etc. He has experienced our joys...Mountain festivals/parades; Halloween Trick-or-Treat Trails, Winterfest, etc. The other two candidates would have to learn second hand about those things and it would take years to even begin to catch up.

Sean comes to the Sandy Chamber. He is loved and appreciated there because he is faithful to show up even though it is not during his "working hours" to learn about the needs and concerns of the business owners in the community as well as the non-profit groups that attend. He connects with these groups, attends the various functions they hold. Sean earned the "Heart of the Community" Award... he is recognized as a positive influence and positive liaison between the community and the police department.

Funding for the Police Department: If additional funding is needed and asked for in the near future, a new Police Chief would be seen as the reason....he isn't satisfied; he doesn't get help from other groups in the community; "Sean was able to manage with what he was given." If Sean was Police Chief, people would believe that it was truly needed, that Sean had tried to manage as long as possible without burdening the people with more taxes. More chance that any additional funding asked for by the voters would be passed than if someone new was the Police Chief.

When asked about the Portland problem spreading out to Gresham and continuing on to Sandy. Sean was aware of the situation and had plans of how to handle it. He even anticipated the new SAM bus route going to Clackamas Town Center might possibly bring into the community people who might cause trouble and had a pro-active plan for that situation. The other two candidates probably don't even know about the new bus route...they aren't local.

Loyalty-What does it say to the rest of the police team about loyalty to them, the current people who serve. Will the next job opening that might be a job promotion for them be given to an outsider? Is their service and time they are investing not valued? Sean served as interim Police Chief...when there was a need, he answered the call and served. My opinion is it would be hard for Sean to remain here in Sandy if he does not get this position. How does a person handle that kind of rejection and still feel self worth and respect from others on the police force. If Sean leaves, others might look elsewhere also. If loyalty and experience here in this community is not valued...they may go where it is valued.

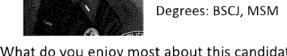

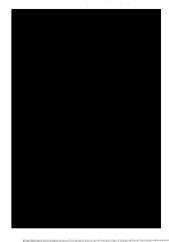
