

Downtown Parking Advisory Committee Regular Meeting Wednesday, June 20, 2012

39250 PIONEER BOULEVARD, CITY HALL COUNCIL CHAMBERS

1. Call to Order – 4:05 PM

2. Public/Visitor Comments or Concerns: None

3. New Business

- a. Parking Open House Discussion: Staff detailed the open house attendance and general input regarding the parking district. The Committee discussed the comments received from the open house. It was decided that the two hour parking district from Meinig to Scales on both Proctor and Pioneer should be forwarded to City Council for approval. Property owners and business owners along that area will be given the opportunity to request shorter time limitation signs. It was also decided that the restrictions for the Heritage Square parking lot should be forwarded to City Council as recommended, except that the six parking spaces along the east side of the Frontier Building should be restricted to one hour. The recommended breakdown for Heritage Square is: 36 spaces without restrictions, 14 spaces with two hour time restrictions, and 6 spaces with one hour time restrictions.
- b. Parking Lot Naming Results: Staff shared the results of the survey that was created to decide the name of the parking lot adjacent to Bruns Avenue. Staff also shared an email from Steven M. Wolf regarding the parking lot names. The results from the survey were as follows: 52.7% (39 people) voted for Pioneer Parking Lot, 24.3% (18 people) voted for Bruns Avenue Parking Lot, 12.2% (9 people) voted for Bruns West Parking Lot, 8.1% (6 people) voted for Sandy West Parking Lot, and 2.7% (2 people) voted for Junker West Parking Lot. The Committee decided to forward the adoption of the name 'Pioneer Parking Lot' to City Council as supported by the citizens of Sandy.
- c. Next Steps for Parking District: Staff detailed the next steps for the parking district; including reviewing the Downtown Parking Management

Study and determining what recommendations still need to be accomplished. There was some discussion regarding other projects that still need to be complete, such as removal of yellow paint from curbs, reconfiguration of parking spaces in Heritage Square, installation of parking signs for the proposed parking district, and the removal of the parking signs in front of the middle school on Pleasant Avenue.

d. ODOT Paving Project: Staff detailed the ODOT Open House that took place on June 18th. ODOT expressed they will place 'no parking' signs in applicable locations. The signs will read "No parking from 8:00 PM to 6:00 AM" and will signify that tow away will occur.
