

Downtown Parking Advisory Committee Regular Meeting Wednesday, January 16, 2013

1. Call to Order - 4:05 PM

2. Public/Visitor Comments or Concerns: None

3. New Business

- a. Requests to Keep Parking Signs:
 - Two Foxes Singing (Ant Farm) DPAC members discussed the letter as submitted by Two Foxes Singing. The committee approved the request with the following decision. Action: 1) Allow three (3) parking spaces at 15 minutes on Proctor Boulevard in front of Sandy Chainsaw and the Ant Farm.
- b. Paid Parking Kiosks vs. Single Space Meters: City staff researched the financial options for paid parking as requested by Chief Yamashita at the September DPAC meeting. The committee reviewed the cost estimates, but agreed that the citizens and visitors of Sandy are not ready for paid parking in downtown, regardless of the program costs. While the cost research is good information to have there is no interest in moving forward at this time. Enforcement will be necessary once the parking district is active and the library parking lot may need additional regulation as there is some issue with turnover. Scott Lazenby asked staff to research parking fine amounts and work with the Police Department to reduce the \$100 fine to something more reasonable, such as \$40. Kevin Moody said that the City will need to buy some new computer and printing equipment for enforcement of the two hour parking district.

4. Old Business

a. Yellow Painted Curbs Removal Project: Staff explained that the third RFP (request for proposal) closed on January 11, 2013 at 5:00 PM with receiving only one bid for \$39,716.50. Staff explained that the bid

amount was above and beyond available funds. The committee discussed using other paint colors to hide the yellow paint, but it was decided that adding more paint to curbs that we do not want painted is not a viable solution. Mike Walker offered to use the public works crew to remove paint from curbs instead of putting the project back out for bid. Although Mike does not know the amount of work that could be done this spring and summer, the public works crew will try to sandblast painted curb as time permits and then we will reevaluate at the end of the summer.

- b. Parking District Update: Staff explained that they are currently in the process of defining the areas to install signs for the two hour parking district. They are researching the possibility of installing shorter signs at around four feet in height, possibly in the furniture zone.
